



THE COURSE

The course is extremely varied, with many holes having been developed on farmland, cleared of gorse and bracken. It offers a complete range of natural hazards from streams, turf banks to gorse.

The longest hole is the par 5 seventh but perhaps the most daunting is the par four dog-leg right eleventh. This hole demands a long and accurate tee shot over a long carry of gorse bushes, to set up a mid-iron second to the green.

The fourth hole is also a favourite with the members, as the stream comes into play with the approach shot to this tricky green.

The greens at Peel are always an excellent element of the course and it requires a certain degree of course management to plot a good score. However, the stunning views from the course and the facilities on offer when you reach the clubhouse make any round of golf here pleasurable.
